ENGAGING EVERY NATION INITIATIVE

In 2016, the TCM Board of Directors sat around the table to discuss and approve the expanded TCM vision - that every nation will have effective leaders of disciple-making movements impacting their churches, cultures, and countries for Christ. Even though TCM's mission did not change, this expanded vision launched TCM into a season of expansion and deepening that slowly began to transform the face of TCM students around the globe. Later that same year, TCM launched the Engaging Every Nation Initiative and over the next few years, raised 2.7 million dollars to allow TCM to deepen in Europe and expand into new countries around the globe. Many of you gave generously to that campaign, and we have been so blessed to share the stories of the lives that have been changed and about ministries that have been started because of TCM's educational ministry in those areas of the world.

Another TCM milestone is quickly approaching. In fact, by the time you read this, TCM will have conducted its first graduation celebration on the continent of Africa. Fourteen Kenyan students have fully completed the TCM ministry training program. Following after them, over 50 other students from Kenya are working at various stages in the program. These graduates and their stories illustrate the fruit of your sacrificial giving as you helped TCM launch into these new areas and equip more effective national leaders to engage in the Great Commission.

But this is just one example. TCM has also expanded into Latvia, the United States, Albania, Liberia, and we are in conversations with Christians in other countries who desire TCM to come and fill the void of ministry training to equip their Christian leaders to reach their own people for Christ more effectively. This is the TCM mission, and we need your help to continue.

MISCHECK'S PASSION



I started full-time ministry in June 2003. I had so much passion. I reached out to thousands of people, and they were responding to the Gospel. They gave their lives to Jesus as their Lord and savior. But there was just something that was not looking right. I now realize that I was doing everything except being with the twelve. I strongly felt that the people I brought to Christ were just weak, feeble Christians. I was teaching them, but they were not maturing. It was frustrating. In that first TCM class, the professor explained disciple-making from Mark 3:14 and the statement he explained to us that struck me with awe was, "...he ordained the twelve so that they could be with him." Then, from his teaching, for the first time my eyes were opened to the fact that success in disciple-making was a walk of obedience. This walk would be a lifetime commitment and it would take real patience to make disciples.

From then on, I realized that I had to really slow down if I was going to make true disciples. Then my problem became how to grow the church that I envisioned with that slow pace. This is when God opened my eyes and gave me a vision: to make 20,000 leaders in 20 years each discipling 50 people in 20 years. This strategy would produce 1,000,000 disciples in 20 years. I am concentrating and walking with my 50 disciples right now whom I am entrusting with

50 disciples each. As they grow, leaving me with less responsibility on them, I will concentrate more on the less mature and target 50 leaders (disciples) at different levels of maturity for 20 years. I have since learned to delegate and follow up with these few as they also delegate and follow up on the few. The chain goes on.



BORN OUT OF CRISIS:

A NEW OPPORTUNITY FOR MAKING DISCIPLES IN EUROPE

The unprovoked aggression of Russia against Ukraine, which began on February 24, 2022, changed the lives of millions and had global consequences. More than five million Ukrainians were forced to leave their homes and move to other countries. Most Ukrainians moved to the countries of the European Union. As in the days of the apostles, God used migration to expand the boundaries of His kingdom. During the war, dozens of pastors and thousands of members of evangelical churches were forced to leave Ukraine and began planting groups and churches in the European diaspora. During the two years of the war, about 150 evangelical groups and churches have been established in Europe. TCM was actively involved in helping brothers and sisters from Ukraine through TCM Regional Representatives in other countries. In 2024 it became evident that the ministry of Ukrainians in Europe needed a more systemic coordination and support.

February 13-16, 2024, a meeting of Ukrainian pastors and church planters in Europe was held at Haus Edelweiss, Austria.

Ukrainian pastors and church planters in Europe from Ukraine, Poland, Germany, Czech Republic, Slovakia, Austria, Croatia, Switzerland, France, Netherlands, and Great Britain attended the meeting. Pastor Valerii Antoniuk, chair of the AUC ECB (All Ukrainian Union of Churches of Evangelical Christians Baptists), and pastor Eduard Petrov, head of the Union's missionary department, traveled from Ukraine. TCM President, Dr. Tony Twist, led the prayer fellowship during the conference.

The meeting at TCM was planned as a time for fellowship and recreation. Some of the Ukrainian pastors came with their spouses and children for whom a program of fellowship and recreation was organized.

All participants of the meeting had the opportunity to relax one evening in the thermae in Baden and to visit a tour of the Heiligenkreuz Monastery the following day. The tour was conducted by a Catholic seminary student from Lviv in Ukraine.

During the three-day conference TCM teachers, Dr. Meego Remmel, Dr. Oti Bunaciu, and Dr. Sorin Badragan, conducted seminars and shared their experiences of ministry in Europe in general and to Ukrainian refugees in particular.

At the meeting it was decided to establish a new Ukrainian regional association of the AUC ECB Union in Europe. The main goal of the new association is evangelism and discipleship in Europe and coordination of various ministries. TCM is one of the key centers for training Christian ministers involved in the movement of multiplication of disciples.

Dr. Tony Twist has invited the leadership of the Union and the in-country coordinators of the new European network to continue and deepen the partnership that was established with Ukrainian churches a long time ago. The regional centers of TCM in Kherson and Lviv are part of the AUC ECB. The field for ministry is expanding beyond Ukraine into the European Union and the Lord has blessed TCM with valuable gifts to empower the new disciple-making Ukrainian network in Europe. The Ukrainian/Russian speaking evangelical church in Vienna (www. evangelie.at) led by members of staff and faculty of TCM is part of the new network that raises new disciples of the Lord Jesus in the times of crises.

All participants of the meeting heartily thank the leadership of the TCM Institute for organizing the meeting, which made an important decision in the life of the Ukrainian evangelical movement in Europe.

Please continue to pray for a speedy end to the war and for the development of Christian discipleship movements in Europe through TCM partnerships with various evangelical unions that share the values and mission of God's Kingdom through the fulfillment of the Great Commission of Jesus.

We want to acknowledge and celebrate the recent accomplishment of our registrar, Victoria Bojonca. Or should we say: Dr. Victoria Bojonca. On March 25, Victoria successfully defended her dissertation, completing her Ph.D. from the School of Theology and Religious Studies located within the University of Bucharest, Romania.

Her research interest and dissertation is titled: Hearing God's Call: A theological reflection on emergence of TCM International Institute as a strategic leadership formation program in a global context.

Her study investigates the motivations and rationales behind TCM's organizational changes, which were driven by a commitment to respond to the perceived needs of churches in Romania between 1975 and 1995, taking the organization from benevolent ministry and literature distribution to leadership formation ministry and offering accredited master's degree studies.

Victoria's work adds to the current documentation of TCM's history, and she hopes that this research will serve as an insight and encouragement to other faith-based organizations and churches to embed spiritual discernment practices into their business practices.

PURPOSEFUL GIFT PLANNING

Now is the perfect time to think about ways to maximize the impact of your 2024 gift. By using one or more of these simple planned giving strategies, you can leave a legacy for future generations, provide a larger charitable gift than you thought possible, and potentially reduce your income tax and/or capital gains tax.

Gift Appreciated Securities Instead of Cash

If you own appreciated stocks, bonds, or mutual funds and have held them for over a year, you can give a portion or the entire value of those appreciated securities to TCM as a smart alternative to cash gifts. With a gift of appreciated securities, you save on income tax and any capital gains tax you would have incurred upon the sale of the securities.

Make a Qualified Charitable Distribution from your IRA

If you are 70 ½ or older, you can make a gift to TCM directly from your IRA without owing income tax on the distribution. Furthermore, the distribution to TCM can count as your required minimum distribution (RMD) for 2024.

Establish a Giving Fund

Experience the joy of giving in your lifetime and beyond by gifting cash from your current income or non-cash assets such as appreciated stocks, bonds, mutual funds, or real estate to a personal or family giving fund. This fund, called a Donor Advised Fund, is a simple and flexible charitable tool which allows you to make distributions to TCM and your other favorite ministries. You choose (2024 or beyond) when and how much to distribute to each of your charities and receive a full deduction this year for the fair market value of your gift.

In 2016 two consultants worked with TCM to initiate what we called the "changing lanes and load bearing walls" process. The Executive Leadership Team (ELT) identified our "lanes," the areas in which we were working, plus new lanes we knew would come

with growth through our Engaging Every Nation Initiative (EEN). Since then, we have seen much progress as new faculty and staff have been onboarded, responsibilities have shifted, and the ELT has doubled in size. And the process is accelerating as the EEN enters the next growth phase with a goal of \$6,000,000 additional income by 2027 dedicated to developing even more effective leaders of disciple making movements around the world who will impact churches, cultures, and countries for Christ.

For 18 years, David Wright has been a mainstay in the growth and advancement of TCM's mission and vision. As many of you have

heard, he is retiring as Vice President of Ministry Services in June. But there is something more you should know and celebrate. David exemplifies the culture of good beginnings, middles, and endings that TCM wants. Not only is he finishing well, but he has also intentionally worked himself out of a job.
