At AADVS, we reflect on the lives touched and the challenges faced by those in our community during the last year. We are deeply committed to supporting individuals and families escaping the devastating effects of domestic violence. During fiscal year 2024, our 24-hour emergency hotline received 887 crisis calls and 120 survivors accessed emergency shelter. As shelter is consistently at capacity, survivors in the community are still in need of critical, life-saving services.

In order to increase the services provided, AADVS will be expanding in 2025! Funding provided through a grant has allowed the purchase of an additional site, which will be the home for outreach services. Not only will outreach services be increased, but the location will be disclosed to the community. The new site will also allow offices to be moved from the shelter, which will create additional bedrooms for survivors.

Every day, brave individuals and families escape the grip of domestic violence, seeking refuge, healing, and a fresh start. But they can't do it alone. They need your help. Your generous donation ensures that we can continue offering a safe haven, case management, and resources to survivors.
