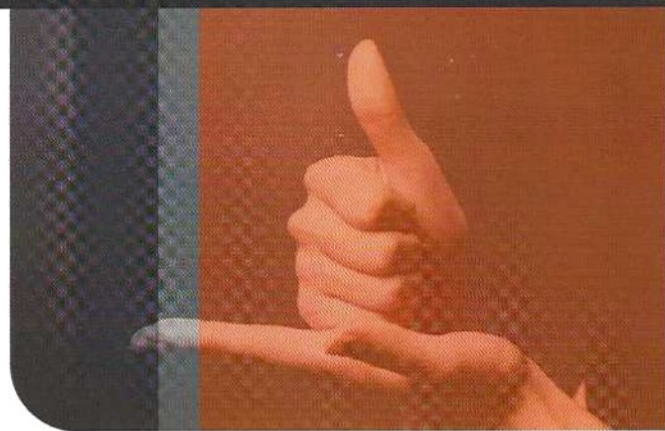

The Old Office Has Sold!

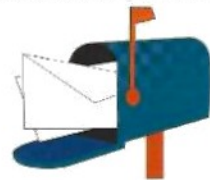

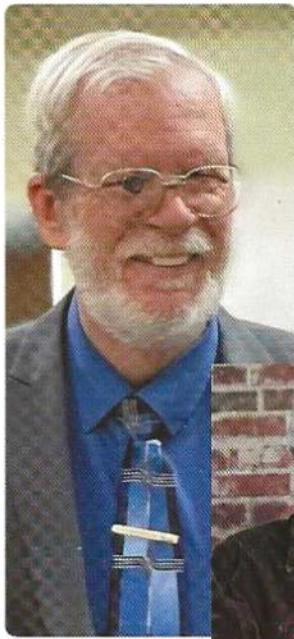

Strategic Planning Committee Updates the Organization Mission

Our Strategic Planning Committee has worked hard to refine and update the mission goals. Now referred to as the organizational "Pillars", they provide more clarity to what Deaf Streetlight's primary mission is. What were 6 long goals have been condensed into 4 concise focal points. The heart of the goals remain very much the same, just simply restated in a better way.

This improvement will help Deaf Streetlight in future grant applications and fundraising work.

Those 4 Restated Goals (in a nutshell) are:

1. Go and Meet - Be involved in (by hosting and participating in) community events, develop relationships & be an asset to the community.
2. Learn and Share - Collect data to create a database to share resources and information.
3. Connect and Support - Train, support & equip churches, include the Deaf in the community and in church, & a DEAF mentorship program.
4. Equip and Empower - Remove barriers, create or support spaces/opportunities for the Deaf to lead.
