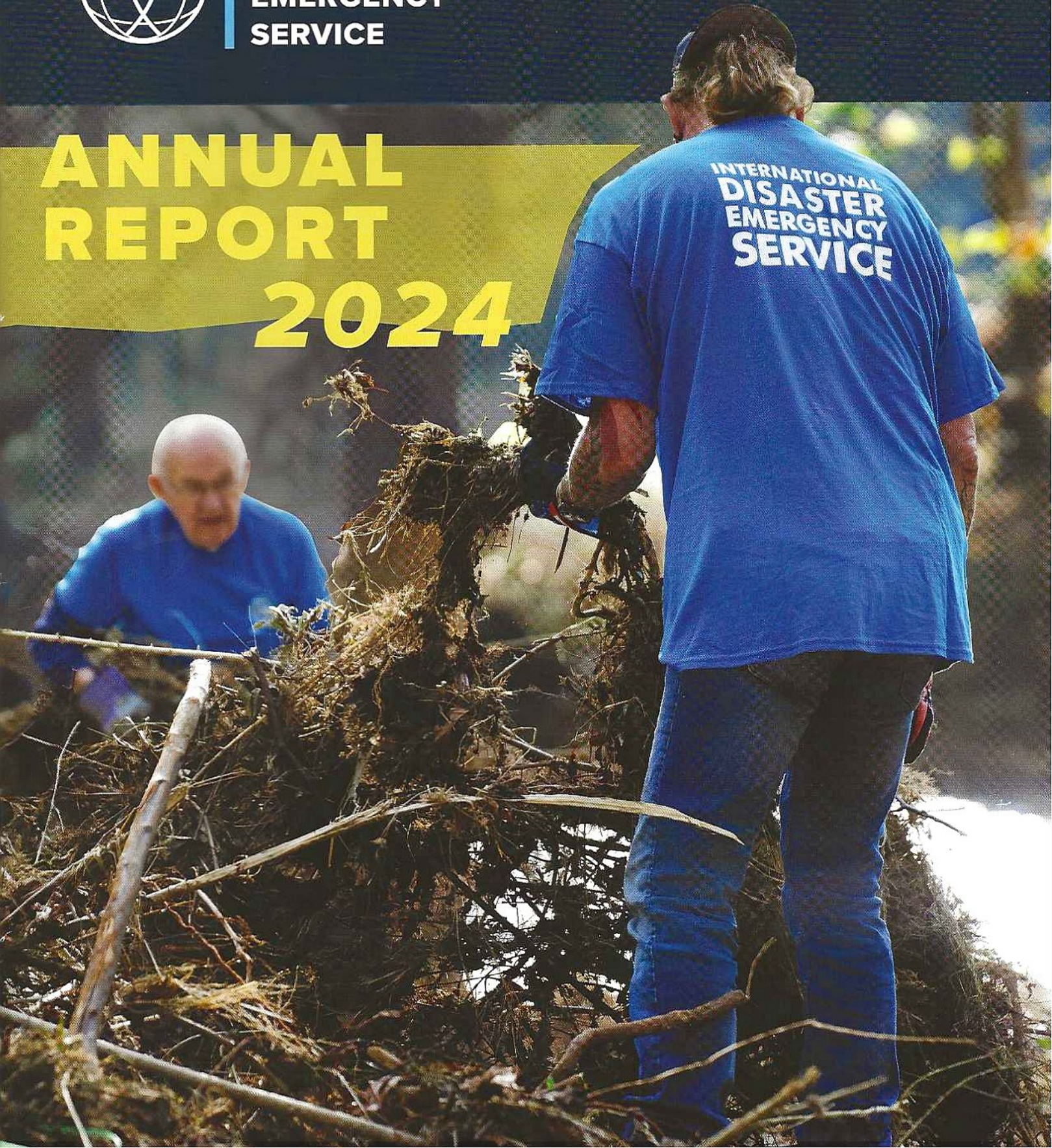

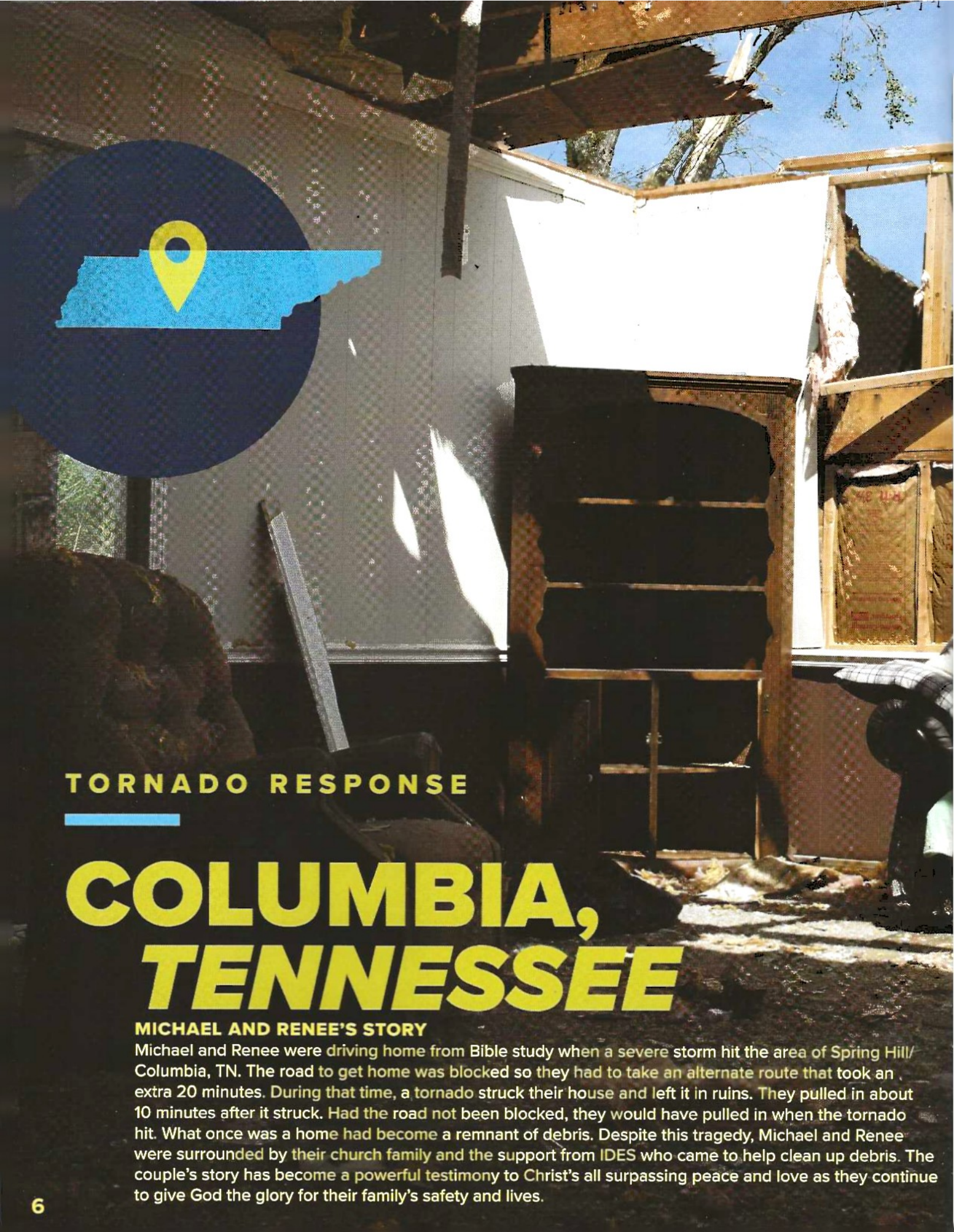

COLUMBIA, TENNESSEE

MICHAEL AND RENEE'S STORY

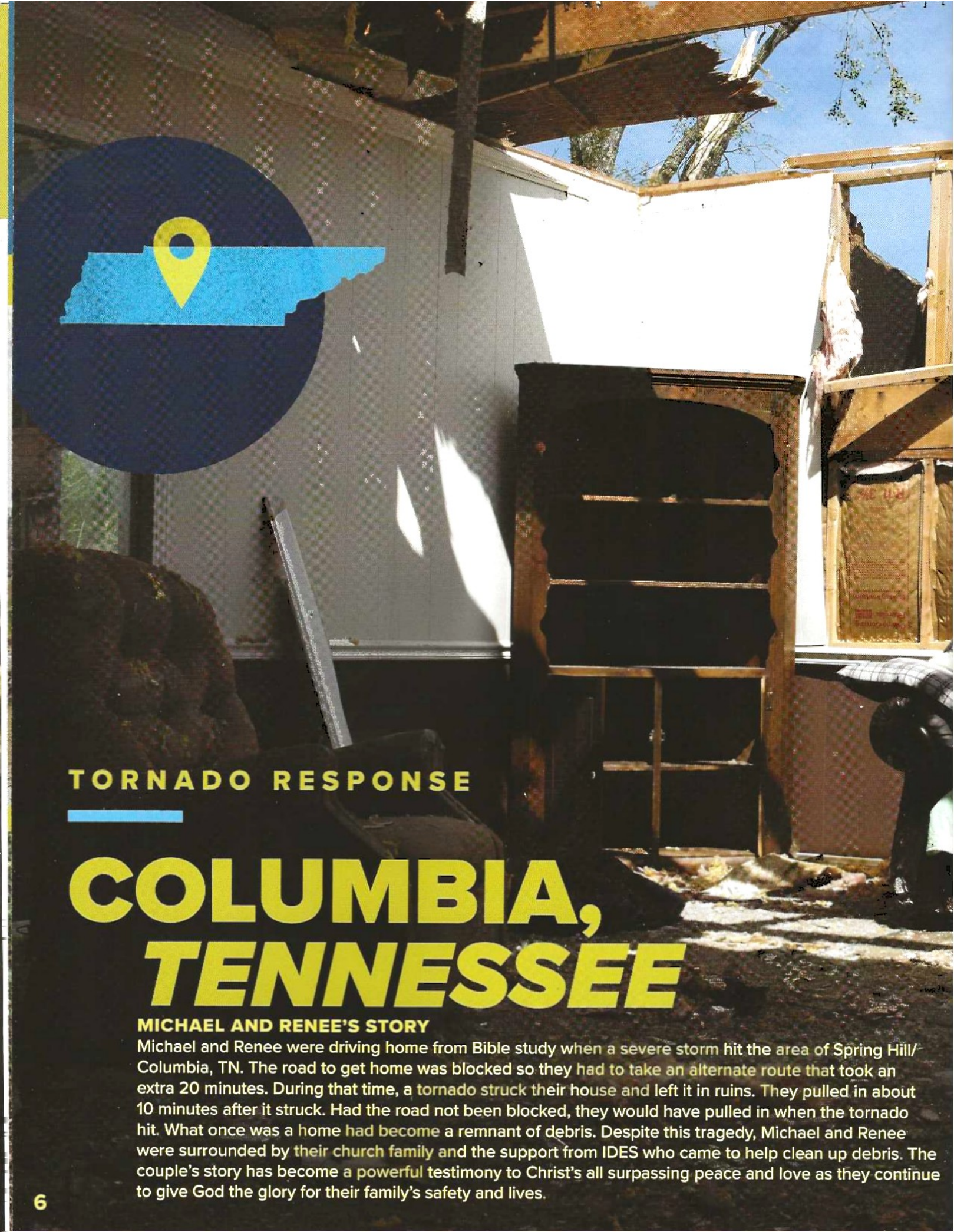
TORNADO RESPONSE

BARNSDALL, OKLAHOMA

BARNSDALL CHRISTIAN CHURCH'S STORY

On May 5, 2024, an EF-4 tornado ripped through the small town of Barnsdall, OK. It damaged over 120 structures, of which over 60 were completely destroyed. IDES was on site within 48 hours of the tornado to partner with Barnsdall Christian Church to help their community with cleanup, repairing homes, patching roofs, and building storage sheds. The outreach into the community has resulted in the restoration of people's faith, commitment, and love for the church. The church was able to show Christ's love in the worst of times and in doing so, made an impact both physically and spiritually as they shared Help and Hope.





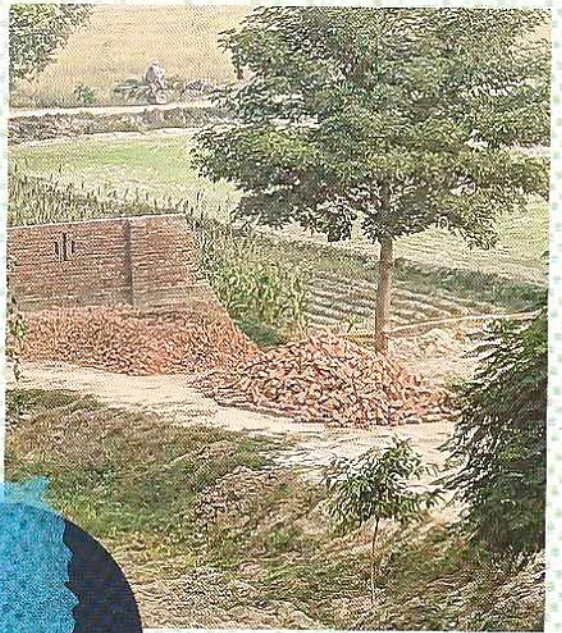
TORNADO RESPONSE

COLUMBIA, TENNESSEE

DISASTER RESPONSE

IDP* PROJECT IN UKRAINE

Prior to the war in Ukraine, Sofia was a struggling single mother of three girls who was forced to raise her family on her own. What was already a vulnerable situation became even more difficult when the war broke out between Russia and Ukraine. Their specific community suffered multiple military attacks and had no access to safe shelter. Sofia and her three girls were forced to pack up their lives and fled to Spain, and then later moved to Romania. Because of their refugee status, the girls were seen as outsiders at school and often beaten by their classmates, even with police present. To make matters worse, the oldest daughter was diagnosed with a bone infection that led them to seek medical help back in Ukraine. The family was now homeless in a war-torn country, exhausted, and left with no hope. But their story was not over.

IDES partners in Ukraine met this family in their darkest moments and helped bear their burdens. The church helped find medical care for the oldest daughter and provided food and other necessities the family left behind in Romania. After so much darkness, the church offered the Help and Hope that Sofia and her family so desperately needed. Pray for the spiritual and physical well-being of Sofia and her three daughters as well as the church as they minister to victims of the war.

DISCIPLE-MAKING

IDP* PROJECT IN THE MIDDLE EAST

For many people in other countries, being a Christian can be life-threatening. "Jonathan" has a wife and 5 kids in the Middle East. In 2019, they came to know Jesus through a relationship with a minister who gave Jonathan an audio Bible. He was soon baptized alongside his family in a secret place. The family was attending church in a place far from their home and it was often unsafe due to extremists in the area. Last year a new Legacy Church was planted near Jonathan and his family. This church provides a safer place within their community for the family to worship. Unfortunately, some relatives have made threats against the family because of their belief in Jesus. Jonathan and his family have decided to stay in the area, despite threats, to continue to reach their community with the gospel. Pray for safety and courage for Jonathan's family and for the Legacy Church to continue to provide a safe place to worship Jesus in a hostile country.

DEVELOPMENT

WELL PROJECT IN GHANA

Clean drinking water is one of the greatest needs across the world. In many areas of Ghana, it's difficult to get access to clean water due to the arid climate and a low water table. After 4 failed attempts of drilling in a remote village in Ghana, the people in the community believed this was a message from their gods that there was no water and no hope. Our IDES partner decided to dig a well near the church in the village, despite doubt and opposition from the community. To the people's shock, fresh clean water began to flow from the well! Not only did the community receive clean water, but doors have been opened to the gospel.

Since the success of the well, our partners say that residents of this predominantly non-Christian community have become curious about the church and have allowed our partner's ministry to be more effective. Please pray this well would cause hearts to be softened and many to come to Christ.

IDES FOCUS AREAS AT WORK IN MYANMAR *and* THAILAND

For 51 years, IDES has provided Help and Hope to those in need, often in places that are overlooked. In 2024, IDES focused heavily on an often neglected area of the world - Myanmar and Thailand. We completed 45 projects in these countries, directly impacting over 82,000 people. While Myanmar and Thailand have long been affected by disasters such as typhoons, cyclones, and monsoon flooding, the past few years have been even more difficult as Myanmar has been entrenched in a civil war since February 2021. Thousands of Burmese people have been killed and millions have been displaced, with many fleeing to Thailand as refugees.

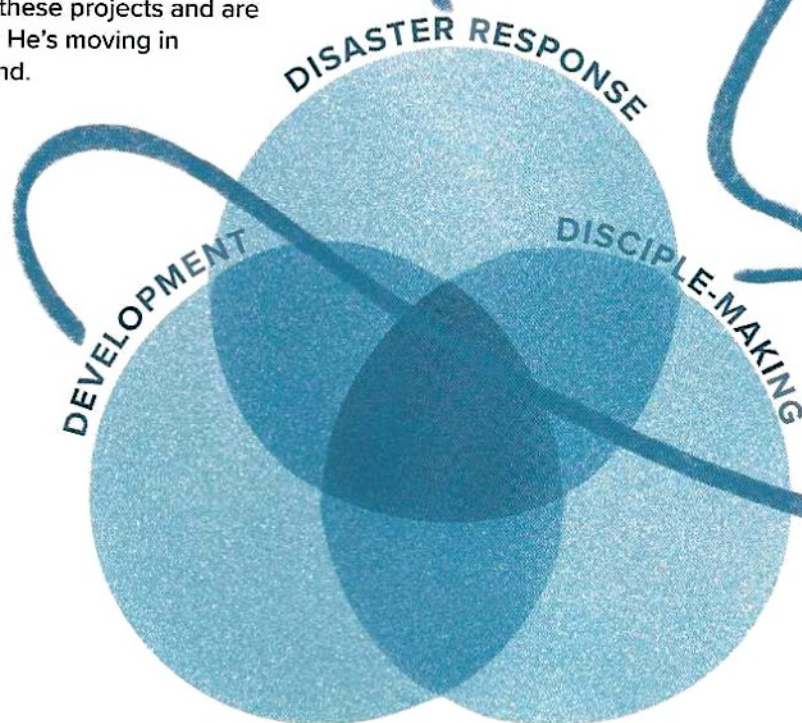
Since the war began, IDES has remained committed to both immediate relief and long-term recovery. In 2024, we were intentional in our efforts to include Disaster Relief, Development, and Disciple-Making projects, ensuring our work has a sustainable, transformative impact. We've seen God's faithfulness through these projects and are excited to share how He's moving in Myanmar and Thailand.

DISASTER RESPONSE

Isaiah and his three daughters live in a village in rural Myanmar. Tragically, Isaiah's wife passed away in 2023 from what they suspect was cancer. The girls were devastated, but Isaiah was determined to continue to care for his family. Then, in early 2024, their village was hit with a wind and hail storm that destroyed all of the crops. In a single night, 700 people lost the food that they would depend on for the entire year and the village was soon on the brink of famine. Though their faith was stretched, Isaiah and his daughters trusted God would care for them. They prayed daily for God's help for their family and village. Their prayers were answered when our partner reached out to IDES to request help for this overwhelming need. IDES was able to provide hundreds of bags of rice for the village - enough to help get them through until more crops could be planted and harvested. Thanks to the generosity of our donors, the hard work of our partners, the prayers of Isaiah's family, and the faithfulness of God to provide, this village was saved from famine and their faith was strengthened!



DISCIPLE-MAKING

In 2022, IDES provided food to a village in rural Myanmar after prices skyrocketed due to the war, leaving people unable to feed their families. Together with our partner, we shared the food and the Gospel with this predominantly Buddhist village. Shortly after, a small group of people began following Jesus. Our partner was faithful to continue preaching and teaching to these new Christians and the Lord continued to add followers. Nearly 2 years later, IDES was able to help construct a Legacy Church for this community to meet in, safe from the elements that previously threatened their meetings. During the construction process, a 67 year old Buddhist woman started talking to the church members and even helped with the construction. By the time the church was built, the woman had committed her life to Christ and decided to get baptized. Her baptism was the first one celebrated at the new church! It's amazing how something as simple as providing food to this village in 2022 has now led to the planting of a new church and the baptism of this woman, along with many others!

DEVELOPMENT

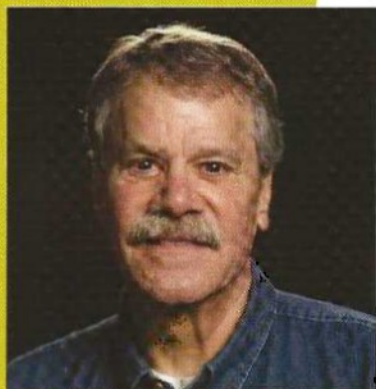
Amos and his family lived in Myanmar when the war broke out. For many months their village remained safe, but the fighting kept creeping closer. One morning, the village was bombed and two of Amos' grandchildren were killed. The next day, Amos, his daughter, and two grandchildren left for Thailand, not knowing what they would find or where they would stay. Fortunately, they found refuge at a community in Mae Sot, Thailand. IDES partners are heavily involved with this community and have been able to serve Amos and his family over the past two years. However, the community is situated next to a landfill, which has contaminated the water. Amos, his family, and the other refugees suffered from frequent stomach illnesses and rashes as a result. In 2024, IDES was able to drill a well so that the community has access to clean water. Now they are no longer suffering from ailments caused by the toxic water. Amos and his family were already followers of Jesus, but now many refugees in the community are becoming more open to the Gospel because of the well. It has shown that they have a Father who cares for them and has created many opportunities to share about the Living Water.

SAFE WORSHIP TRAINING

WITH IDES

Each year, Ed Sanow, our Director of Training, conducts two dozen Safe Worship workshops in churches throughout the US. The building blocks of the program are building access control, greater training, unarmed safety team training, armed security team training, handling common medical emergencies, special emphasis on child grooming awareness, and lessons learned from violence in churches. These four hours of training on the best practices of safeguarding houses of worship help churches just beginning a safety program to get on to a good start.

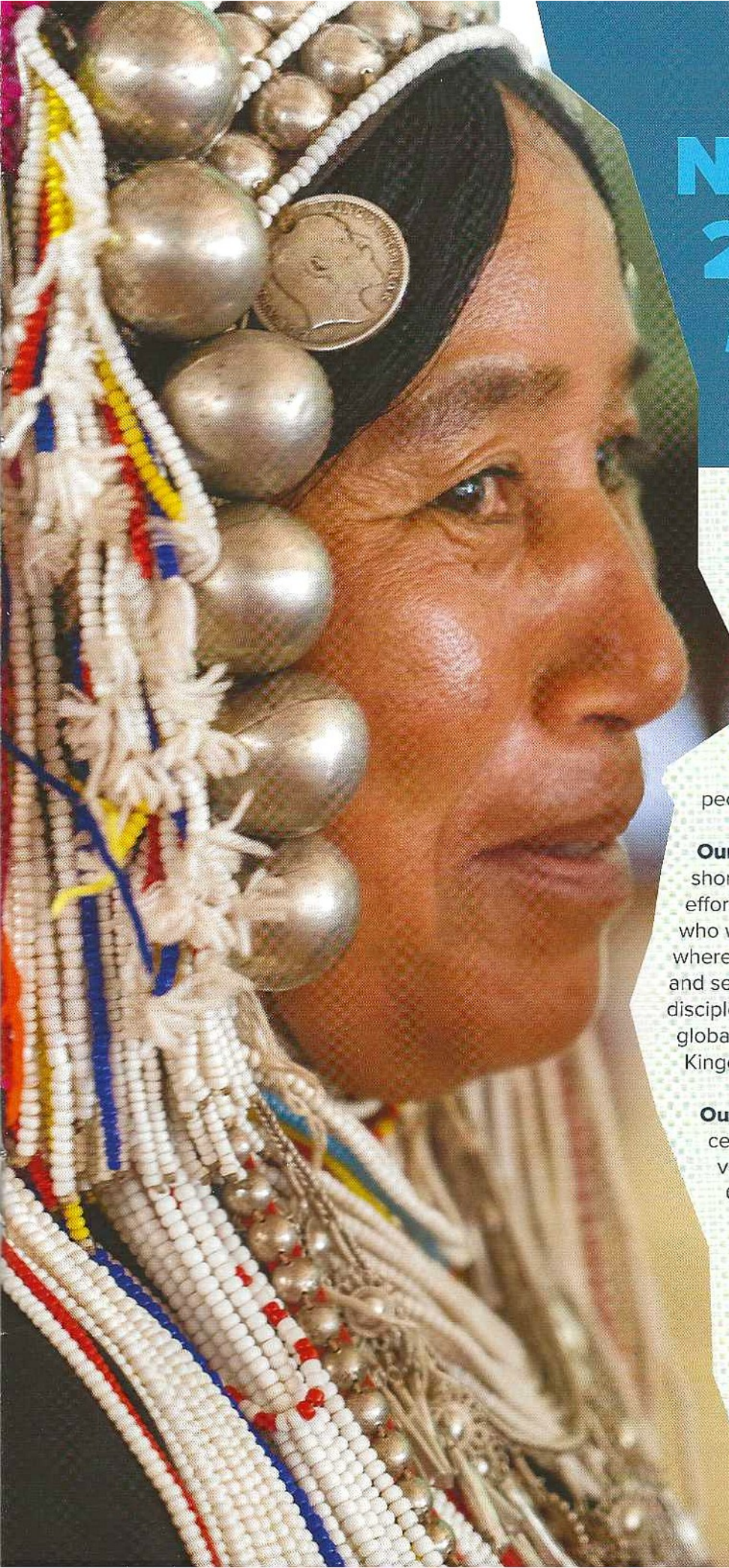
The training also works for already established safety/security teams, serving as an instructor-led, peer-reviewed assessment of the program. This training provides insight into the widest scope of the term "safety" as it pertains separately to Youth, Adults, and Seniors.

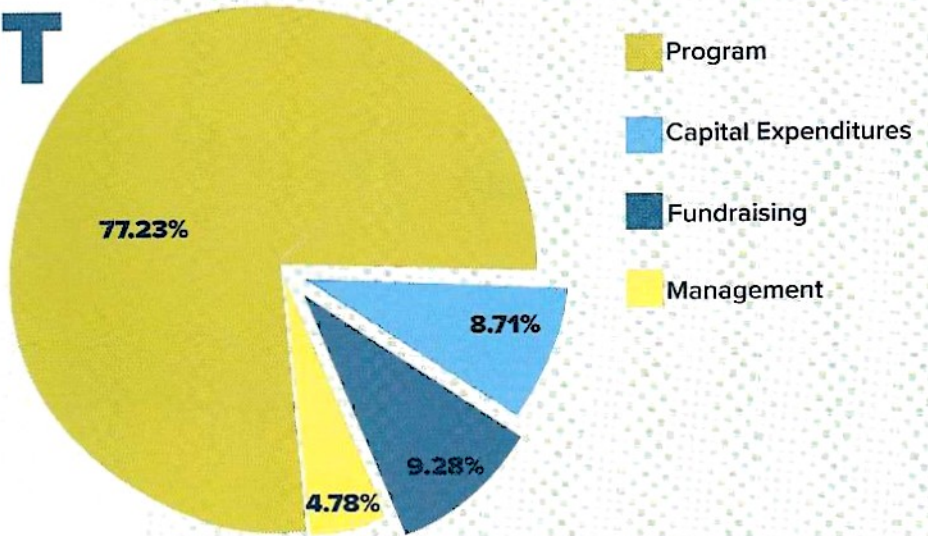
