Saying Yes to God's Plans for My Life

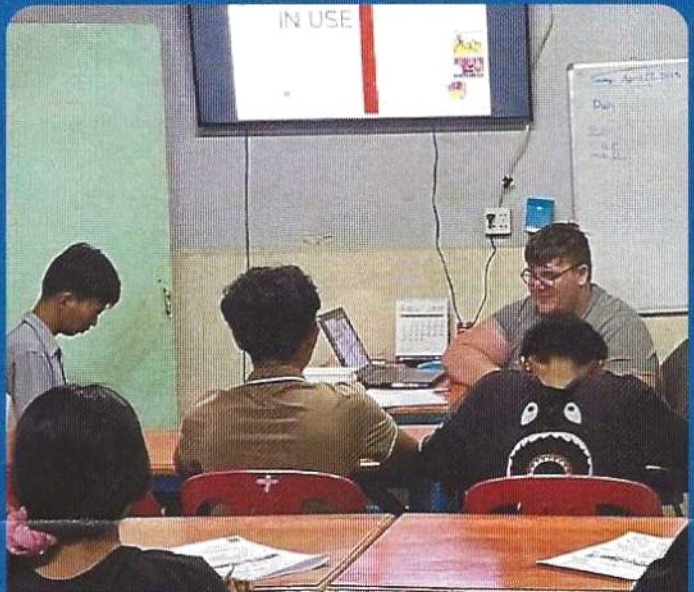

Andrew Teaching English to Cambodian Students

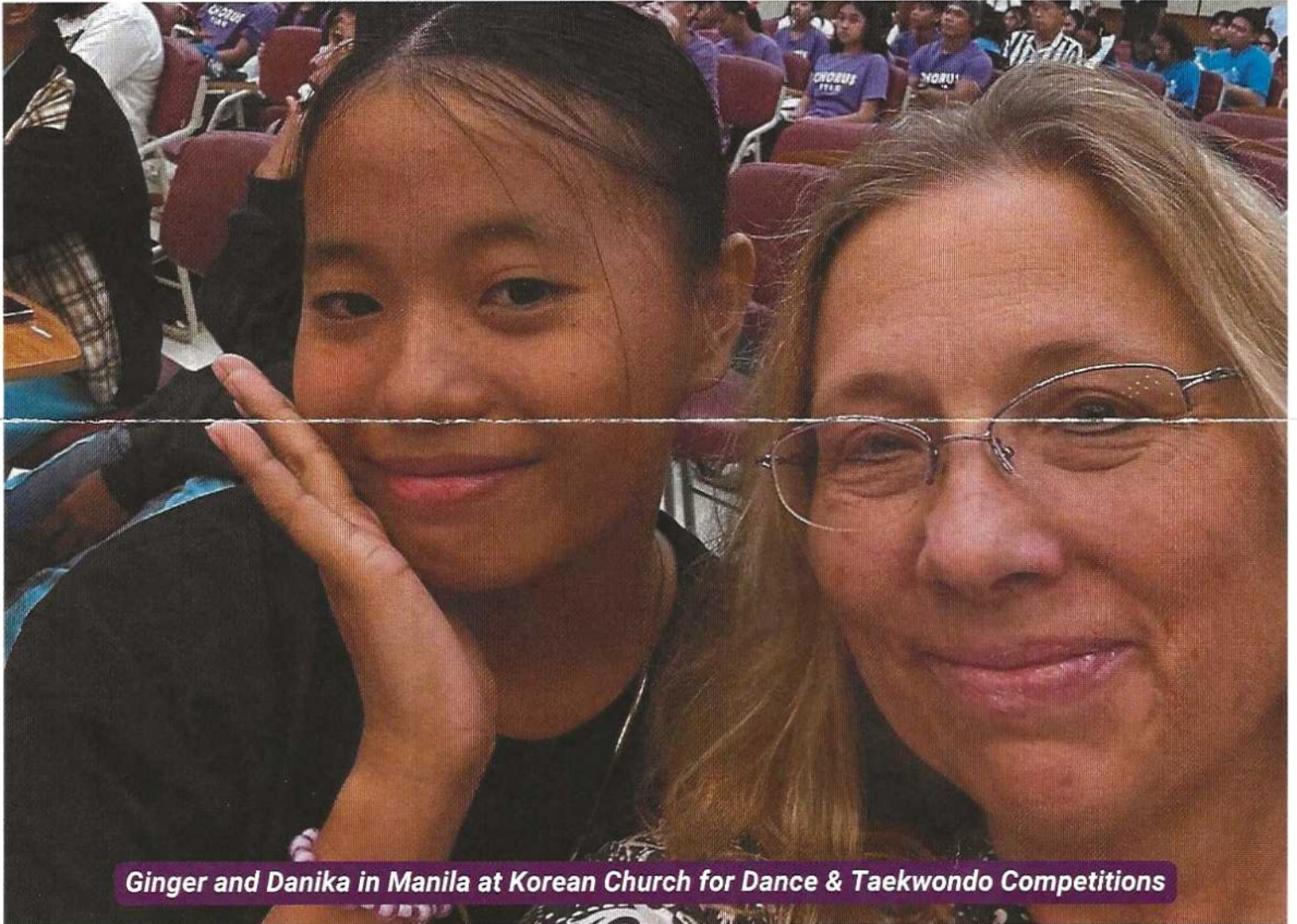

Passion drives us to act – it powers late nights of youth worship, early morning prayer time, and the continuous effort to grow. I cherish the unique spark that makes me stand out, the spark that God placed in my heart to serve the children here in Bacoor, Philippines.

English Instruction

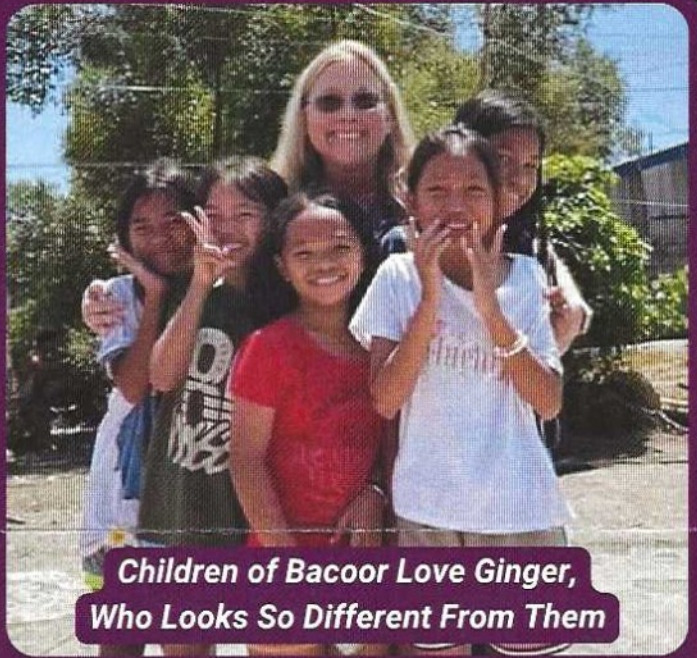
Since my arrival, I have provided English instruction, supporting Pastor Kim and Lisa with pronunciation guidance and addressing students' vocabulary inquiries. My instructional approach addresses not only students' immediate questions, but also their long-term vocational and communicative needs, requiring exclusive English use during peer interactions. It demonstrates that learning happens everywhere, not just in classrooms. Life's challenges and successes have offered valuable lessons to me, and my mentors have guided me along the way. Now, as a mentor and teacher myself, I aim to share what I have learned. Each class starts with a vocabulary test covering spelling, syllable count, and usage understanding, followed by B1-Intermediate-level lessons and exercises. Students have been introduced to grammatical concepts such as active and passive voice, adverbial clauses, "going to/with" statements, and sentence structure. Classes end with oral readings from "Our Daily Bread" or similar biblical materials to reinforce and assess pronunciation and punctuation skills.

Student Progress

I have seen my students make impressive progress in a brief time – gaining confidence not only in English, but also in expressing themselves and supporting each other. Their willingness to have discussions and share during readings highlights growth beyond academics; it is about courage, humility, and helping others. I learn from their perspectives, which foster reflection and community. Even with the moves due to government action, we adapt, and they remain motivated to learn.

Facilitating Communication Between Missionaries

Supporting CRAM's Field Director, Pastor Sang Ho Kim, and his wife Lisa has involved facilitating communication between English- and Korean-speaking missionaries, including during visits by representatives such as Tom and Lou from Central Christian Church in Wichita, Kansas. This work has contributed to mutual understanding and collaboration among those involved. Missionaries regularly visit Bacoor to observe Pastor Kim's impactful community activities, especially during the 2025 Vacation Bible School (VBS) program.

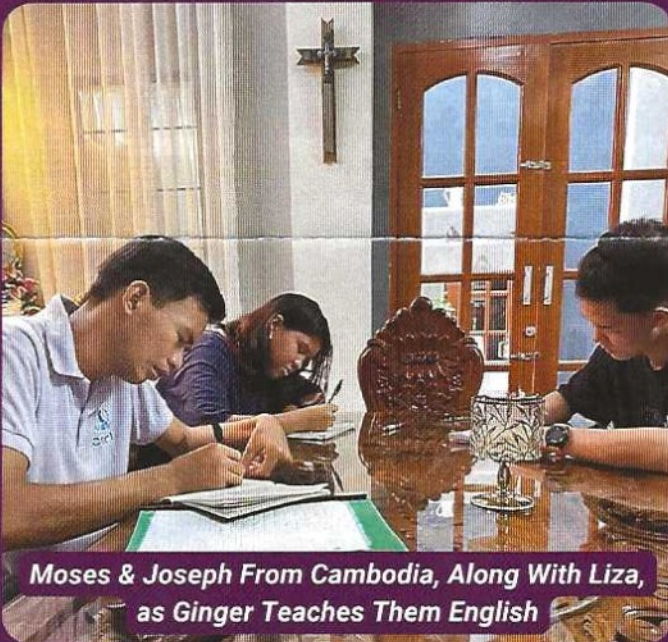
2025's Vacation Bible School

This year's Vacation Bible School (VBS), running from May 19 to June 10, 2025, was nothing short of wonderful.
