Most likely, many of you watched the flooding in our area that recently occurred. For three days at the end of September, rains fell first in the neighboring town of Miami, then on the San Carlos Apache Reservation and then in the city of Globe. Many saw the devastation on national news as homes were destroyed, hundreds of propane tanks floated down the creek, and over 50 cars were swept away. Just two weeks later, more flooding occurred, causing more damage. We're so thankful for your prayers on behalf of this ministry, the ARM team, and those impacted significantly by the incredible power of twenty-foot currents in creek beds that usually are dry.

It was Friday night in downtown Globe where many restaurants were serving their patrons when the wall of water rushed through. There are many stories of people who were **miraculously** rescued. Water flowed across the top of the bridge in San Carlos! Inspectors had to ensure that it was safe to once again cross. In all of the devastation, the miracles of lives saved are innumerable. The communities came together to muck the mud, restore businesses and comfort those impacted. ARM's tractor helped with clean-up, team members and family delivered food, gift cards for clean underwear, etc. The generosity of partners allowed us to serve during this critical time.



Because of the losses incurred by the above-mentioned flooding, as well as the on-going needs of a Tribe deeply in need of assistance, our Critical Needs collections continue. 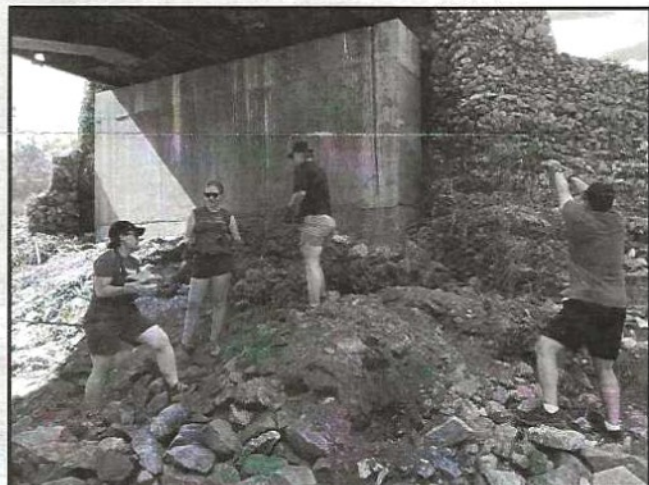

Having our RV there to provide a safe place to play with blocks or coloring pictures about God's power and love was appreciated by all. Providing popcorn, cotton candy, spin-art and a bean bag toss were fun ways to join the many Tribal agencies who shared activities at their booths as well.

We were also able to host an Apache Pastor Appreciation Banquet. Pastors, wives and family members arrived from ten of the churches on the Reservation. The theme was recognizing their positions in the front lines of very real spiritual battles. Macaiah Hill of the ARM Team served well for ten years within the U.S. Marines. His message of encouragement to these Spiritual Soldiers was a blessing to us all. Prayers were shared between our team and those in attendance after a wonderful meal. Gifts were distributed, games were enjoyed, and a survey from each was gathered so that we can better know how to serve them.



Just after the first round of flooding occurred, a team from One Life Church in Mesa, AZ joined us for the day, providing help with several projects, including helping to host yet another Family Fun Day. The next afternoon, First Christian Church, Johnson City, TN arrived. They were such a blessing in many ways! Gabion baskets were filled with rock beneath our bridge. The crew helping install the shingles on the Morgan family's home were determined to complete the task before leaving. Unknown at the time, the night they departed, the second round of flooding occurred. Both of those tasks were orchestrated by the Lord and saved us from further damage. On October 25<sup>th</sup>, we enjoyed the return of a team from LifePoint Church in San Tan Valley, AZ. Their help on the Morgan family's home was such an encouragement as well! As October was ending, we welcomed the return of a team from Northside Christian Church, New Albany, IN. Their team was able to accomplish much at the Morgans' parsonage, our Safe House AND within the ARM offices/dormitory. Our team consists of 13 people... nine are from the Reservation. The tasks we accomplish are far larger than this team. God continues to bless us in mighty and miraculous ways... at times, by providing just the right team of Short-Term Missionaries!



We're grateful for the many 45" x 60" hand-tied fleece blankets that have already arrived to be part of our Christmas projects! We're praying for the toys, candy, socks, toothbrushes, toothpaste and flashlights we'll need for the 800 Christmas Stockings we're also hoping to fill! As you receive this, the sorting, counting and more will, Lord willing, be nearly completed. Please pray for this project and for the lives it will impact.
