## CRAM Worldwide Begins New Work in Myanmar (formerly Burma)

### Meet Robinson Mana, New Field Director

Robinson's family background was spirit worship (Nat worship), but in 1993, American missionaries—including the Morse family—shared the Gospel with the Rawang people. His father believed and was baptized by J. Russell Morse, and their family embraced the Good News of Jesus Christ.

According to the stories that reached our Rawang people, the message that "Jesus is the God who conquers spirits and demons" was excellent news for my father and our relatives. They had not been worshipping spirits out of genuine belief but had been making offerings and sacrifices out of fear of the trouble the spirits might cause. They were excited to hear the Truth of God's Word and to follow the path of the one true God and His Only Begotten Son, Jesus Christ.

Today, Robinson continues that legacy of faith. Robinson served two terms as President of the Myanmar Bible Institute and now leads the **Myanmar Christian Seminary** in Nay Pyi Taw, Myanmar's new capital city. In just a few months, we have helped establish **nine churches** and launched a **seminary with 20 students**—marking the first Church of Christ/Christian presence in the new capital.

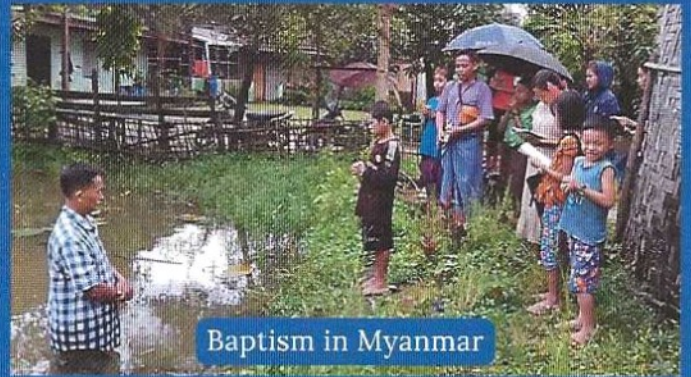
### Meet Robinson and His Family
