# EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Annual Reports tend to focus heavily on the numbers: How many people did we help? How many countries did we serve in? Number of deployments, meals, clean water wells, surgeries, homes built, dollars raised, dollars spent, and more. Trust me, my team is used to me coming up with new metrics we should track! Numbers can show great activity, but at the end of the day, **numbers are just numbers until you give them a name.**

***IDES Partners and Field Workers do an incredible job of turning Relief into Relationships.***

Our numbers might be IDPs (Internally Displaced People) like **Mykola**, his wife, and five kids who received relief through the cold winter months as they struggle in a war-torn country. They could be disaster survivors like **Lemme** and his family, who survived the devastating earthquake in Myanmar, where IDES partners made sure they had food and supplies for recovery. I think of **Zico** in Liberia, who was trained in sustainable agriculture through Farming God's Way. And **David** in El Salvador, where IDES Recruits were able to impact him through their sports ministry. Our numbers represent **Paulo**, a young boy in Brazil, where IDES Medical Partners can treat patients like him more effectively because of the X-ray machines we provided. **Susan** (name changed for security reasons), in a Restricted Access country, is a single mother with ten children. IDES supplied food and a clean water well for her village to help sustain her family and many others in the midst of religious turmoil and political upheaval. Our numbers reflect IDES Field Workers in New Zealand working with **Sarah**, who wanted nothing to do with God, but after coming to our church plant and being disciplined, gave her life to Christ.

When you read through all the numbers in this Annual Report, don't just see numbers; see the hundreds of thousands of names those numbers represent- people who received Help and, even more importantly, heard Hope in Christ last year.



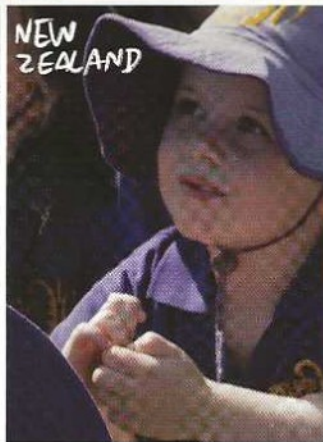
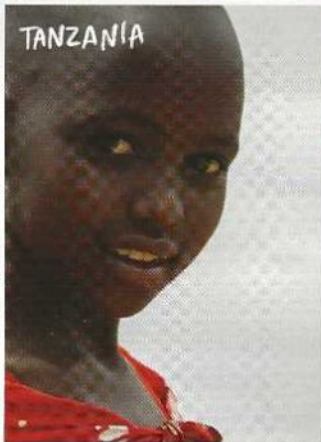
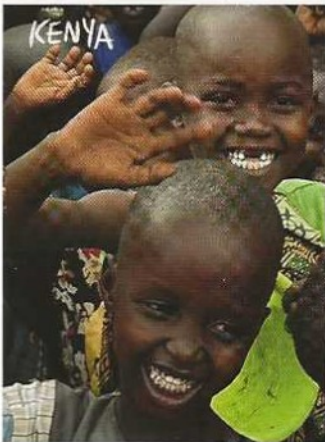
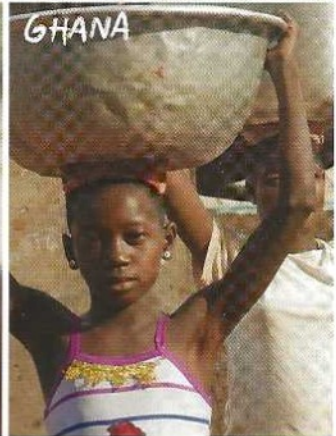
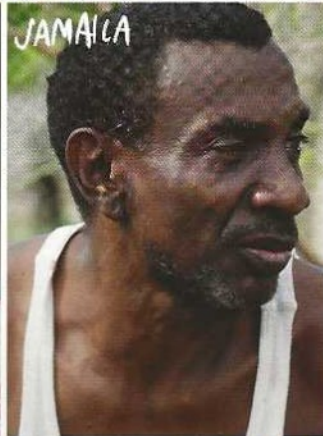
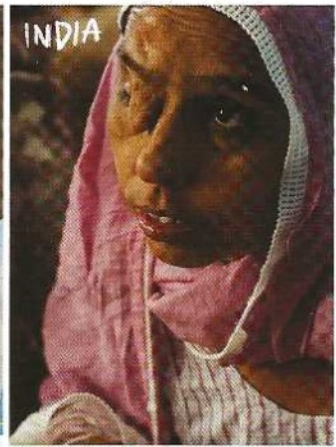
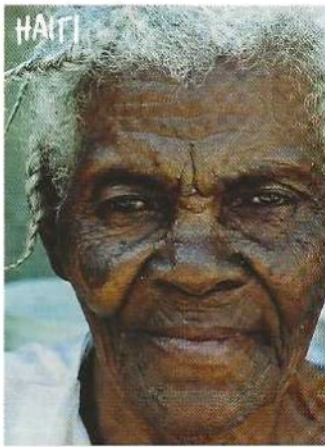
IDES is always trying to reach more people for Christ, and we are thrilled with the progress in our Expanding Help and Hope Capital Campaign!

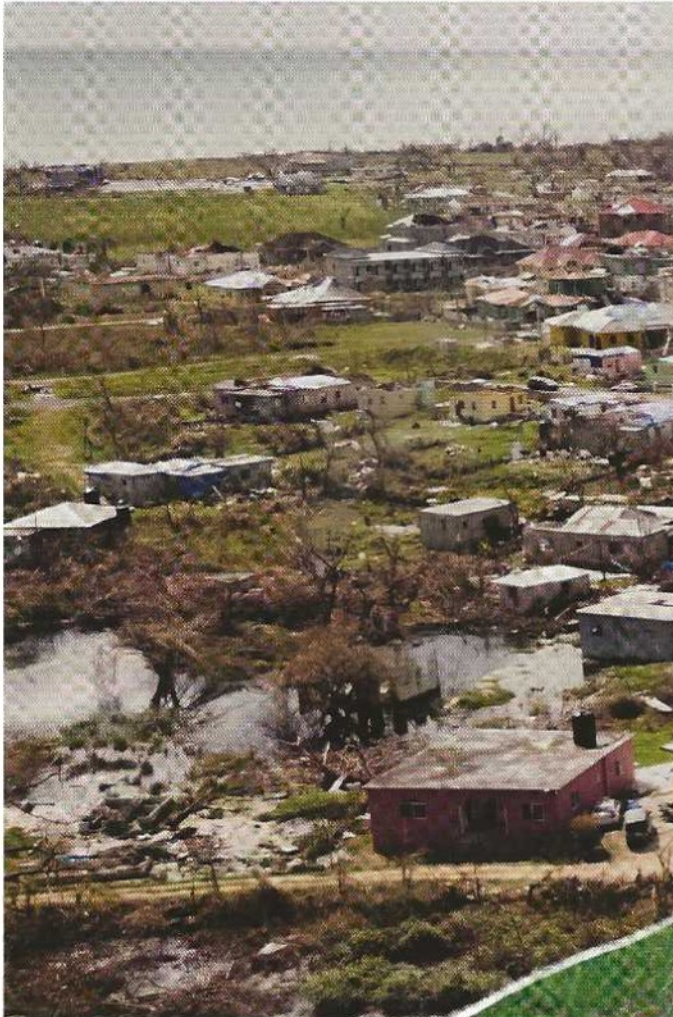

# HURRICANE MELISSA

## Pastors Serving their Communities

Pastor Steve and Grace are pictured with Pastor Vin, both shepherding churches in hard hit areas of Jamaica. IDES was able to provide resources to both congregations as well as provide encouragement and prayer for the pastors ministering to their communities.



Hurricane Melissa was the strongest storm to hit Jamaica in its recorded history. Making landfall in the country on October 28, 2025, wind gusts grew to over 250 mph, setting records and causing extensive damage.

IDES was in contact with partners and churches in Jamaica immediately after the storm. The people our team encountered lost much, but the spirit of the church was one of thankfulness. Many families we met lost roofs and personal items to flooding, but the lives of their loved ones were spared.

As the photographer, photographs do not do justice to replicate the sorrow and joy the people of Jamaica are now feeling. The path back to normalcy will be a long journey, but IDES is coming alongside our church partners in the country to help restore. IDES has partners in various locations in Jamaica, including Black River, which was one of the hardest hit communities. We're also working with partners in Haiti and Cuba, both of which sustained damage from the hurricane. We sent relief supplies at the end of 2025 and look to provide more help and hope to those hurting in Jamaica in 2026.

## A Tennessee Home

This is one of numerous homes IDES helped rebuild in the Tennessee and North Carolina Appalachian region. A church group traveled from Indiana to Tennessee to assist with the construction of the home shown in the picture below. They were one of many volunteer groups who gave of their time and talents.





In the hills of east Tennessee, Billy Joe Blevins is one of the many who lost his home and so many of his possessions in the unprecedented Appalachian flooding of Hurricane Helene.

Mr. Blevins is an older man who served our country. He walks around with a slight hobble, usually wearing a ballcap and a smile. A smile that masks the loss and pain he has gone through. He watched his longtime home shredded and carried off by the Nolichucky River in September of 2024, and then as he started to put his life back together, he faced an unexpected cancer diagnosis.

IDES had the privilege of working with the local church, and volunteers from across the country, to build Mr. Blevins a new home. The footers were poured in the early days of spring, and as the home progressed, I would see Mr. Blevins smile, knowing he was a little bit closer to moving out of his trailer and into his new home.

Following a hot summer of work on the house, Mr. Blevins was blessed with great news on multiple fronts. The cancer he had been battling vanished from the scans - a testament to prayer and God's sovereign hand - and IDES along with our partner, Boones Creek Christian Church, turned the keys of his new abode over to Mr. Blevins.

# BUILDING CAMPAIGN



### Global Impact Center

Since its completion in late October 2025, the Global Impact Center has significantly boosted IDES' outreach efforts. The Center is now equipped to accommodate large groups for our GAP food packing events. Furthermore, the expanded storage capacity for rice, materials, and ingredients allows us to maintain a large enough inventory to host more food packs in 2026 and beyond, while simultaneously helping to reduce costs. The addition of the Center also provides essential space in our US Response Center, enabling us to significantly increase the number of lives we can reach with Help and Hope after U.S. disasters.

### GAP Expanding

The Global Impact Center's inaugural shipment in December 2025 went to a mission partner in Ukraine, delivering winter essentials. This collection included jackets, shoes, boots, gloves, over-the-counter medicines, wheelchairs, and other supplies that are vital to our outreach in the war-torn country. Our churches and mission partners in Ukraine remain the sole source of assistance and hope for thousands of people in need. The long-term objective for our GAP ministry is to broaden its scope, moving beyond solely distributing food packs to include a wider range of essential shipments.

### Administrative Offices

The next step in our Expanding Help and Hope initiative for 2026 is Phase 2: the construction of our new Administrative Offices. This development is crucial for IDES to enhance the effectiveness and efficiency of our disaster response efforts, both in the US and internationally. 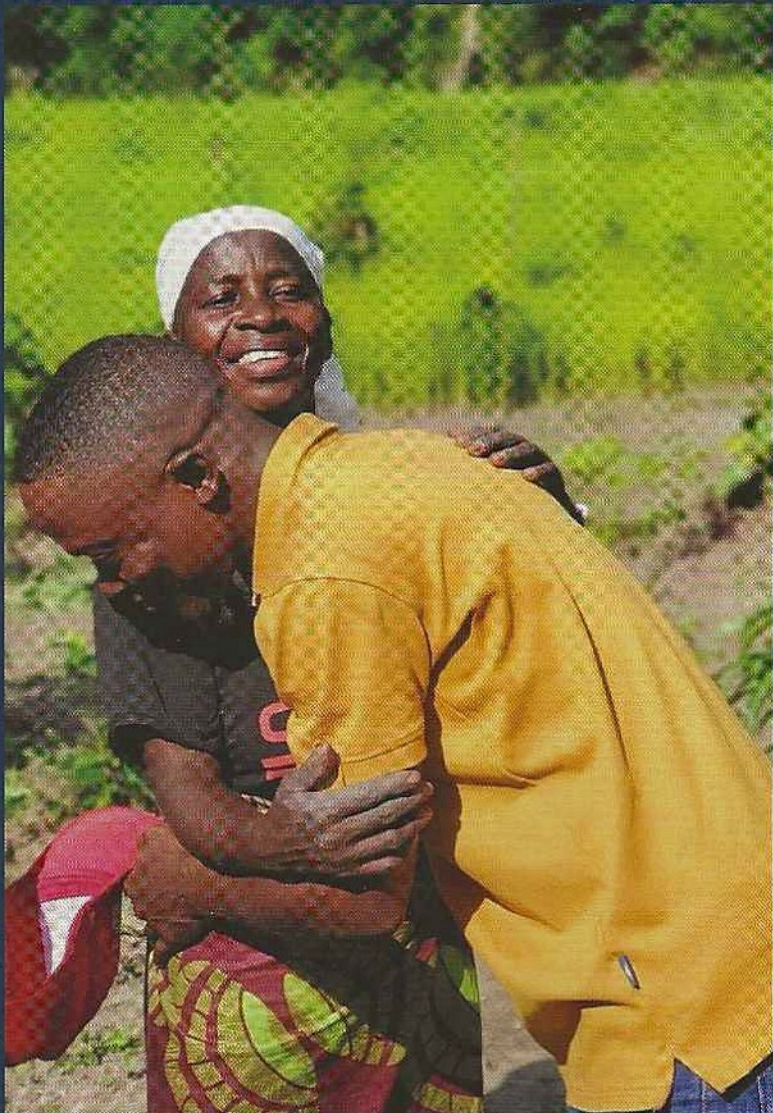

# INTERNATIONAL AID HIGHLIGHTS



## DEVELOPMENT

### Farms in Liberia

Since 2023, IDES has worked with a partner in Liberia to start 26 farms, including 10 this past year. The villages are trained in the principles of Farming God's Way, provided with the tools they need, given a well (when needed) - and the results have been incredible! These farms are seeing yields that were never thought possible. Families and villages have been transformed because, for the first time in recent memory, they have plentiful harvests to fuel their minds and bodies.

Even more exciting, God has been moving mightily through these farms! People are accepting Christ and being baptized, new disciples are actively growing in faith and in knowledge of the Lord, churches are being planted, and church plants are reaching their neighboring villages with the Gospel. The impact is almost too much to count when you think about the transformation happening on the individual, family, and village levels.

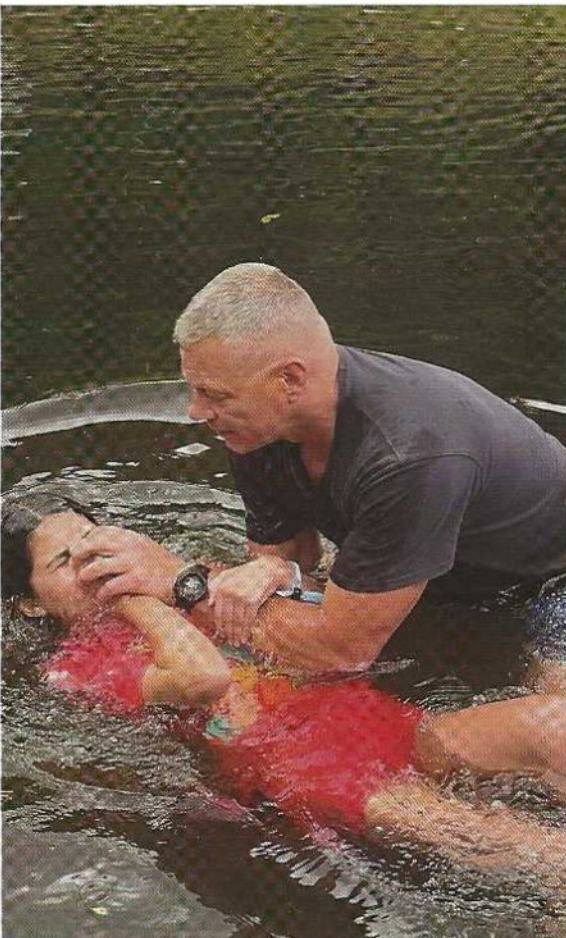
Take Whapoetay, for example. A few years ago, at the start of our original farming project with this partner, he was growing marijuana in an effort to make money to feed his family. Our partner gave him the opportunity to learn proper farming techniques and to grow corn. They also shared the Gospel with him. He believed in Jesus, got baptized, and started leading the farm work in his village. He introduced his friends to Jesus, baptized them, and helped plant a church in his village. He has now undergone two years of intensive Bible training and is preaching in three villages every Sunday, as well as leading Bible studies. So, not only has Whapoetay's family been transformed, to now have a stable source of food and income, but so have many families in his village. Whapoetay is now a disciple of Jesus that is making new disciples of Jesus. This process is being replicated over and over, throughout many of the 26 farms that our partner in Liberia has started with help from IDES. Praise God for all that He is doing!

# DISASTER RESPONSE

## Earthquake in the Philippines

In a span of seven weeks in late 2025, a 7.0 magnitude earthquake and back-to-back typhoons hit the Philippines, causing destruction across the country. The compounding impacts of these disasters have left hundreds of thousands of people in need of assistance, but have also opened doors for the Gospel.

One of our dedicated partners reached a remote village in the mountains after the earthquake. The earthquake caused significant damage to the surrounding areas, which meant that most people could not work. Without work, the families in the village went without food. Government aid trucks couldn't reach the remote village, but our partners were able to get food in and help with some small home repairs. They were intentional to share the Gospel and eight people were baptized, with many more expressing a desire to follow Christ. For most, it was the first time they had ever heard about Jesus. A small church started gathering and our partners continued to disciple the new believers. When the typhoons hit, IDES was able to work with our partners to provide much needed food again. Now, some families in the village, new to the faith, have started walking to other villages to teach songs and Bible stories. As our partners tell it, "They want to share the hope that they have found."



# DISCIPLE MAKING

## An IDES Field Workers Update

Field Workers are IDES' missionaries meeting long-term physical and spiritual needs of a community. Through our Field Workers, IDES has the ability to better evaluate, assess, and execute on Kingdom-focused projects.

Our Field Workers in New Zealand, Michael and Rosalind Trusty, are working to communicate the need for Jesus to a secular culture. They lead a church plant in a highly multicultural community and are diligent to engage with and meet needs of the people around them.

Recently, the Trustys were able to baptize 3 members of a family from Brazil! The teenage daughter, Rafaela, began attending a girls' Bible study two years ago. Rafaela encouraged her parents to start attending church and God has been moving in their lives. Over the past couple of months, they have been learning about baptism and while at the church's family camp, Michael baptized Oli (the father), Denise (the mother), and Rafaela. The five-year-old sister, (Mykaela) cried while watching the baptisms because she wanted to be baptized too!

God is working through the Trustys in exciting ways in New Zealand! Please join us in praying for their ministry and for non-believers in their community to continue to come to know Christ.

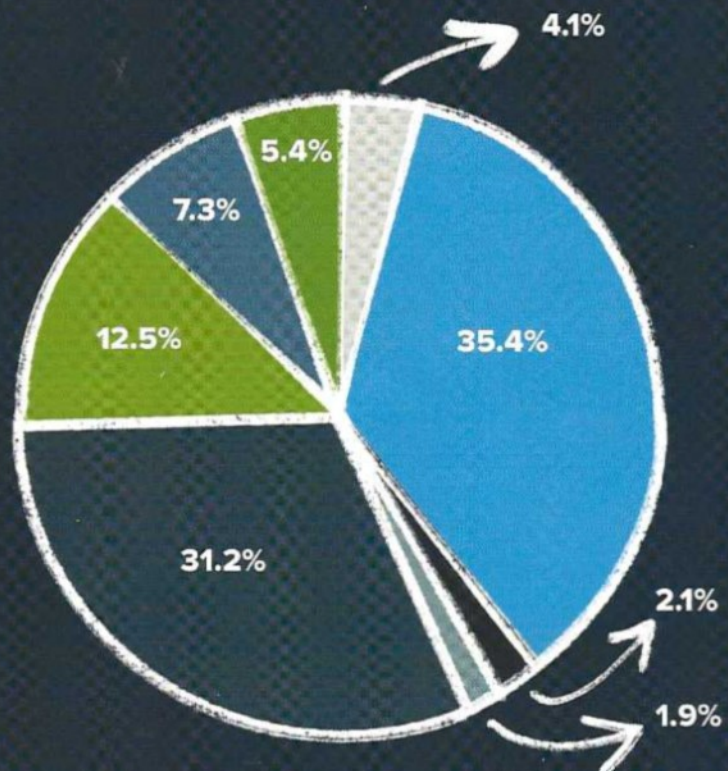
