As another year has begun, we continue to thank God for those He calls to come alongside us in so many ways. During a recent ARM Team Meeting, the activity and focus was on 1 Corinthians 12:14-26. We're one "Body" with many invaluable parts. Members on this team are able to hoist heavy beams to repair our bridge or rocks to fill the gabion baskets. Some are incredibly capable teachers/preachers. Others can recognize needs and encourage partners to help with them, while still others coach basketball teams of teens, have the discernment and love to distribute items to those in great need. Those on the ARM team are encouraging pastors and other Apache Christians that God has placed in critical positions, designing and collaborating with Pastors to build sanctuaries or families to build houses and ordering and delivering the materials so that they can become a reality, building as God leads, counseling the heartbroken in person or on-line, coordinating the logistics for short-term missionaries...and so much more. That's what the body of believers Christ has compiled here in Arizona does. But, without those elsewhere who regularly pray for us, send a note or email to encourage us, provide the funds, care packages, Christmas stocking stuffers, food, blankets, diapers, backpacks, etc., what God has called *us* to do would be impossible. We want to thank you.

As Christmas unfolded, we were blessed to provide 700 Christmas stockings to children and teens, special gifts to elders as a party was planned for them, and over a *thousand* 45" x 60" hand-tied fleece blankets! Since then, a significant amount of gently used coats, and blankets along with knit caps have also been given to those in need as temperatures here dip below freezing, and many reside within structures that have no heat. The delivery of food and other critical care items continues from friends and partners as well. The gifts provided have an impact that stretches into eternity. Again...thank you!

People have arrived to join in traveling through the San Carlos Apache Reservation to see first-hand the truly Third-World situations brothers and sisters endure less than two hours from the Phoenix airport. You do not need a passport to serve here. Prayers are honestly our greatest need.
