## Pause With Dawes

We have completed the 24<sup>th</sup> **Winter Worship Workshop** and what a great meeting this was! (See photos throughout this newsletter) The attendance numbers exceeded last year's numbers with a high attendance of 614 on Tuesday morning. When we left Pigeon Forge on Thursday morning, Danny Evans



challenged us to exceed 650 in attendance for 2027. One of the highlights this year was the preaching by 13 year-old Deacon Davis, son of Aaron and Stephanie Davis. I am sure we will be hearing great things from this young man in the years ahead.

In the Old Testament we read about the Bread of the Presence. It is also called the show-bread. This bread was always present on the table in the tabernacle and later also in the temple. We can read about this bread in Leviticus 24:5-9. Here is what we can learn about the Bread of the Presence: a) it was baked from the finest flour b) it was baked in twelve loaves, with each loaf having two-tenths of an ephah of flour (*an ephah was about seven pounds*) c) the bread was stacked on the table in two piles,

six loaves in each pile d) the bread was covered with frankincense e) it served as a memorial food offering to the Lord. Only Aaron and his sons could eat this bread in a holy place. The bread was set out on the table every Sabbath day.

Likely this bread was prepared on Friday and put on the table in the tabernacle on every Sabbath day. Each week new bread was baked to replace the bread on the table.

We might recall the occasion when David, while running from King Saul, asked the priest Ahimelech for food. The priest gave David the bread of the Presence to eat. David was not a priest and so technically it was not lawful for David to eat the bread. Later, Jesus speaks of this time and he uses this to prove that the Law was made for man's benefit, and that he (Jesus) is Lord of the Sabbath. (Matthew 12:1-8)

The Bread of the Presence in the Old Testament symbolized the presence of God with His people. The term 'bread of the Presence' translates to 'bread of the face', thus indicating it was a visible sign of God's face or presence.

Today we can see a similarity in the Bread of the Presence to Jesus, the Bread of Life. In the Lord's Supper, Jesus took bread and broke it telling his disciples 'this is my body.' We understand it is not the literal body of Jesus, but it is symbolic of his sacrifice for us and his presence with us. We recall the account of Jesus with the two on the Emmaus Road. As the two were telling the others of their experience, they said – Luke 24:35 – *Then the two told what had happened on the way, and how Jesus was recognized by them when he broke the bread.*

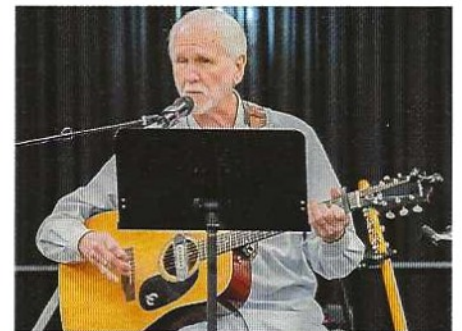
## Learning With Larry

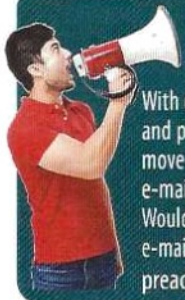
